Congress Convenes

New Senators/Elected Officials Take Office

CAC will begin the process of engaging new and returning Senators, and House members, highlighting the urgency of action on climate change and holding accountable climate deniers. Essentially, we want the pressure to act on climate to be pervasive, particularly for newly-elected members of Congress and/or "frontliners."

Action Request: If you are meeting with new (or returning) members, please lead with unified tested messaging to frame your conversation.

Inauguration Day

Virtual community/press events before/
after or day of Inauguration. CAC will
promote Biden watch parties. We will also
invite press, amplify mentions of climate
on social, hook for follow up opinion
media. Tie to upcoming executive orders,
nominations, and action on climate.
Messaging will be deployed as well.

Amplify mentions on social media. Make the connection back from/to climate if needed.



Early Executive Actions

Overall goal:

Elevate the significance of early action on climate, conservation, and environmental justice in a way the engages the public, demonstrates the strength of the environmental movement, and builds momentum for continued ambitious action

- Drive a strong narrative in the press to elevate and validate the Biden administration's environmental agenda and thwart opposition
- Produce strong grasstops response
- Build power with key constituencies in target states
- Communicate significance of EOs to environmental movement
- Participate in a set of joint tactics that celebrate early wins, high-profile opinion media and paid media (digital, print)
- Report back so we can demonstrate the energy and momentum behind progress on our issues

Create and provide messaging and infrastructure support to promote, defend, and demand the confirmation of qualified nominees.


