Our nation has a rare opportunity to secure the future of America's oceans and protect the country from some of the worst ravages of sea level rise, coastal flooding and a changing climate.

The Joint Ocean Commission Initiative (JOCI) stands ready to assist Congress and the Administration as you as you move toward swift implementation of broadly supported ocean provisions in the bipartisan infrastructure bill, as well as fulfilling commitments to the U.S. Nationally Determined Contributions to the Paris Accord. JOCI is composed of bipartisan ocean leaders, including members of the Pew Oceans Commission and the US Commission on Ocean Policy. Both commissions spent three years initiating a national dialogue about ocean policy, and recommendations were submitted to Congress as a blueprint for a national ocean policy.

Rarely have we seen a convergence of resources and leadership that can empower the country to equitably confront the existential challenge of climate change, including its dramatic impact on our oceans. Last year Congress provided a powerful tool to address climate impacts in the newly codified Ocean Policy Committee. When combined with the significant resources included in the Senate-approved Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, we can take vital steps to protect coastal communities and our national economy. These resources include nearly a half billion dollars for the National Ocean and Coastal Security Fund, \$491 million for NOAA's Community-based Restoration Program, as well as funding for port infrastructure and electrification, mapping, coastal flood control, protecting vulnerable communities, etc.

We encourage Congress to work in tandem with the Administration to develop a U.S. ocean-climate action plan as a key component of US leadership to reduce GHG emissions by 50-52 percent by 2030.

Our oceans and coasts are vital to our nation's economy and security. Oceans are the engines of our planet's weather and climate systems. It is hard to imagine a better return on investment than securing the health and future of our oceans in a just and equitable manner.

The global climate crisis presents enormous opportunities for US leadership and job creation that can result in economic growth and a safer, more sustainable planet. Oceans can play a central and powerful role in forging a new pathway to a low-carbon, climate resilient future. They are also the foundation for growing the blue economy, which is expected to grow at twice the rate of the overall economy.

We urge you to provide the resources and support for an actionable, enforceable, equitable and all-of-government ocean action agenda that harnesses the ability of the ocean to reduce emissions, address poverty and inequity, and promote coastal resilience, peace and security.

We greatly look forward to working with the Congressional Leadership to achieve these ends.
