# CAC UPDATE: EPA Listening Session in San Francisco, California

February 28, 2018

## OVERVIEW

Campaign partners coordinated with advocates and local officials in the Bay Area where "more than 500 Californians crowded into the San Francisco Public Library" and rallied outside to <u>voice their support for</u> <u>the Clean Power Plan</u> at an official Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) listening session. The listening session was the second of three hearings being held by the agency. At the first listening session in Kansas City, Missouri, Midwesterners overwhelmed EPA official with their support for the lifesaving standards. The third and last listening session will take place on March 27 in Gillette, Wyoming, where we expect to see much more support for repealing the Clean Power Plan.

## RALLY TO PROTECT THE CLEAN POWER PLAN

- San Francisco Mayor Mark Farrell hosted an incredibly well-attended Clean Power Plan rally and press conference at San Francisco City Hall, in concert with EPA's Clean Power Plan repeal listening session.
- Elected officials from San Francisco to Sacramento, well-known advocates like Tom Steyer of NextGen America, and kids and parents in support of the CPP and other clean air and climate

policies were among the **nearly 500 people in attendance**. The crowd included about 200 <u>kids</u> **from Urban Promise Academy in Oakland, CA** who spoke to need for the Clean Power Plan and other policies like it that can protect their future and transition us to a clean energy economy.

#### IN THE HEARING ROOMS

- Testimony was almost unanimously in favor of maintaining the current Clean Power Plan and against repeal. The docket was full and overwhelmingly favors proponents of the protection of CPP, mirroring other hearings in Missouri and West Virginia.
- According to the EPA, there were approximately 250 speakers, an additional 250 attendees, 280 students, and 15 elected officials and agency leads at the session. Only about 3 to 5 people provided statements in support of the repeal plan.
- Two speakers, both grandsons of dirty energy industry workers, called on Pruitt to resign.





one was the grandson of a coal miner who testified opposing the repeal and calling for Pruitt to resign for **"dereliction of duty."** The other was the grandson of an oil rig engineer.

- The most pervasive theme across comments was **extreme weather** and climate change, often tied to **emotional accounts of the wildfires in Northern California**. **Public health** impacts and **clean energy jobs** were also popular themes.
- The main hearing room offered **live Spanish language translations** for Spanish-speakers listening in the room, and English translations if they gave **testimony in Spanish**.
- Notable testifiers include the <u>SF Mayor Mark Farrell</u>, Tom Steyer, several CA State Agency Heads and Regulators (CARB, CalEPA, CPUC), representatives from federal and local elected official offices (including the city council and office of Sen. Feinstein) staff from Oregon and WA Departments of Environmental Quality, representatives from two CA power companies (PG&E and Southern California Edison) who previously made statements supporting the CPP, <u>Rev.</u> <u>Ambrose Carrol of Green the Church</u>, and the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce's executive director and other local Chamber leaders
